

## **Course Guidelines to meet ASHA requirements**

*One course in each of the following areas is required for clinical certification by ASHA.*

Courses used to meet these requirements can be taken at any university or college (including community colleges or a junior college) and can be any level. Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate credit noted on your college transcript is also acceptable to meet these requirements.

### **Physical Science Courses**
