Applications are now being accepted for the Richard F. Curlee Memorial Scholarship for the 2019-2020 academic year. Dr. Curlee was recognized for his distinguished contributions to the field of communication sciences and disorders, especially in the area of stuttering. Through his remarkable career, he received numerous awards, among them the UA Faculty of Science Distinguished Teaching Award, the Honors of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, and his most prized award, the Malcolm Fraser Award from the Stuttering Foundation of America.

Eligible candidates for this scholarship:

- Current speech-language pathology graduate students at the University of Arizona (must have completed at least one semester of graduate training at UA and will be taking classes at UA in the upcoming school year)
- Cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher
- Preference for students with financial need (FAFSA not required)
- One-time award (no renewals for previous recipients of this award)

Applicants should submit the following material by Friday, March 22nd, at 5:00 PM:

- Application form (second page of this document)
- Resume listing past honors and awards, past or current scholarships, community or school-related activities, memberships, and/ or work experience
- Personal statement describing your personal attributes, unique qualities, and goals (not more than one page)
- Letter of recommendation from one faculty member in the UA Department of Speech, Language, and Hearing Sciences (she/he will send letter directly to Dana Eriksson)
- A statement of financial need

Awarding process:

- Applications are due by Friday, March 22nd, at 5:00 PM, submitted in Room 214.
- All applicants will be notified when selections are finalized, which is typically by the end of April or early May.
- A thank you note from awardee to donor(s) is strongly encouraged.
